Items Discussed	<p>A.2 The Board must approve the monitoring update for Goal 2 Progress Measures 1, 2, and 3 and Goal 3 Progress Measure 1. Goal 2 states: The percentage of 3rd grade students performing at or above grade level in math, as measured by the Meets Grade Level Standard on STAAR, will increase 8 percentage points from 46% in spring 2019 to 54% in spring 2024. Goal 3 states: The percentage of graduates that meet the criteria for CCMR as measured in Domain 1 of the state accountability system will increase 8 percentage points from 63% for 2017-18 graduates to 71% for 2022-2023 graduates reported in 2024.</p>
	<p>E.1 State law requires schools to submit campus-level goals aligned to the Board-developed district goals as part of their School Improvement Plans (SIP). The Board must review and approve the campus goals and strategies the district has created based on prior student performance and broken down by student demographics to ensure the goals are aligned and targeted to equitably address student needs.</p>
	<p>G.1 Approval of the term contract employment areas that could be affected by a reduction in force. This item is approved annually.</p>
	<p>G.2 Approval of the continuing contract teaching fields that could be affected by a reduction in force. This item is approved annually.</p>
